# R v Kaye

### Her Majesty the Queen against Morgan Kaye

#### Morgan Kaye stands charged:

 That he/she, on or about the 14th of September 2019, in the City of Mariposa, did by criminal negligence to wit: failing to comply with the *Fire Code* in his/her rooming house cause the death of Carl George contrary to section 220 of the Criminal Code.

#### Criminal Code of Canada

(RSC, 1985, c. C-46, as am.)

#### Criminal negligence

219 (1) Every one is criminally negligent who

- (a) in doing anything, or
- (b) in omitting to do anything that it is his duty to do,

shows wanton or reckless disregard for the lives or safety of other persons.

#### Definition of duty

(2) For the purposes of this section, *duty* means a duty imposed by law.

#### Causing death by criminal negligence

- **220** Every person who by criminal negligence causes death to another person is guilty of an indictable offence and liable
- (a) where a firearm is used in the commission of the offence, to imprisonment for life and to a minimum punishment of imprisonment for a term of four years; and
- **(b)** in any other case, to imprisonment for life.

#### **Sworn Statement of Alex Riley**

1 I am a Fire Prevention Officer and Investigator with the Mariposa Fire Service. I am 2 responsible for the inspection of residential, industrial, commercial and other public 3 buildings to ensure compliance with our fire laws and regulations. I am also a member of the Canadian Association of Fire Investigators and have over 10 years of experience 4 5 in fire prevention and investigation. 6 7 On Friday July 19, 2019, I was dispatched to 50 Knightsbridge Garden Circle to inspect 8 a two-story detached house. I was greeted by an individual named Blair Brown. After I 9 identified myself and explained why I was there, Blair granted me access to the house. 10 11 I started my inspection of the house on the second floor. This floor had three bedrooms 12 labelled with a number (#1, #2 and #3). Each bedroom had its own lock. Bedrooms #1 13 and 2 were locked so I was unable to access them. I was given access to Bedroom #3 14 by Carl George. Carl occupied this bedroom. I also saw a kitchen on the second floor in 15 which there was a refrigerator as well as a plug-in hot plate and oven sitting on the 16 wood floor. 17 18 On the first floor, there was a kitchen with two refrigerators, two stoves and a microwave 19 oven. There was also a large common area with stairs that led to the basement. The 20 basement had a single bedroom and washroom. It did not have a kitchen. 21 22 As I went through the house, I noted a number of violations of the Fire Code related to 23 retrofits. Retrofits are necessary to bring existing buildings up to the current minimum 24 life safety standards. There was a sign on the front lawn advertising rooms for rent with 25 a phone number. I called the number and spoke with the owner, Morgan Kaye. We set

up a meeting at the house for August 11, 2019. I told Morgan that on the next visit I

would need access to all rooms, that a working smoke alarm was needed on all floors



I returned to the house on August 11 and met with Morgan. Since the bedrooms were being rented to individual tenants, each of the bedrooms required a smoke alarm and a proper fire-resistant door. None of the bedrooms had these. So based on what I saw, I issued a Notice of Violation that identified the specific sections of the Fire Code that were problematic. The fixes required to bring the house up to code were also set out in detail, namely the requirement for interconnected smoke alarms, smoke alarms in each bedroom, fire-resistant doors throughout the house, and the requirement for a carbon monoxide detector on each floor. The Notice of Violation was mailed to Morgan and presented in person during my next visit.

During my visit on August 15, I walked through the home with Morgan and pointed out what was needed to make the home compliant. We also discussed at length the requirement for a smoke alarm and fire resistant door for each bedroom on the second floor given the present living arrangements.

I returned to the house for a fourth time on August 26. While I saw some progress had been made on certain deficiencies, there was still no correction to the nine doors that needed to be retrofitted, the interconnected smoke alarm and pull system had not been installed, and there were no smoke alarms in each bedroom. I reviewed these violations with Morgan again. We then discussed the potential requirements for the house if it was to be rented to a single family instead, as it had been in 2015. I told Morgan that in that case, the smoke alarms in each bedroom and fire-resistant doors would not be required.

On September 13, 2019, I received a voicemail from Morgan requesting a further inspection of the house to confirm that all of the violations had been addressed. Early in the morning on September 14, 2019, before I could schedule that visit, I was informed that there had been a serious fire at the house overnight. I went to the house immediately to determine its origin and cause.

As I walked through the fire scene, I found that the fire originated in room #3 on the second floor, which contained the hot plate. I noticed that the doors of the second floor



bedrooms had locks on them. I did not find smoke alarms in each bedroom, and the doors had not been retrofitted. I found the burned remains of one smoke alarm on the staircase to the second floor. This alarm had no batteries in it. I also saw two other alarms sitting on a shoe rack on the main floor. One was labelled "main floor" and one labelled "basement". Both of these alarms had been removed by the firefighters. The "main floor" smoke alarm did not have batteries. The "basement" smoke alarm had a battery but did not activate as it was out of the smoke/fire zone.

I later learned that Carl, the occupant of the bedroom where the fire started, died of smoke inhalation.

#### **Sworn Statement of Siham Sanga**

1 My name is Siham Sanga. I lived on the second floor at 50 Knightsbridge Garden Circle, 2 prior to the fire on September 14, 2019. I moved into 50 Knightsbridge Garden Circle in 3 May 2019. The house itself was cramped, and the walls were paper-thin. I used to work 4 at Fifi's bakery just around the block, so the location was ideal, and the rent was only 5 \$375 a month. Though I didn't know them, Carl George and Parker Reed must have 6 moved in at pretty much the same time as I did, since I remember every day that week it 7 seemed like there was a moving truck blocking the sidewalk. They both seemed nice 8 enough, but honestly, I didn't even know their last names until all of this happened. I 9 remember putting my signature on the lease, but I never got my copy from the landlord, 10 Morgan. I was told it was just a "formality". 11 12 I had been living in the house for a few months when something happened that made 13 me suspicious of the rental situation. It was late in the morning on August 27, 2019, and 14 I had just worked an overnight shift at Fifi's, because all the baking needs to be fresh for the customers in the morning. I was feeling pretty groggy when Morgan knocked on my 15 16 door. Morgan must have knocked on Carl's and Parker's doors already because they 17 were both out in the hallway, looking just as confused as I was. I remember thinking that 18 we had never all been home at the same time. 19 20 Morgan started talking about us not playing with the fire alarms. I felt a little bit guilty 21 because I had taken the batteries out of the fire alarm once or twice before, but I always 22 put them back! And it wasn't my fault - I think something was wrong with that alarm. It 23 went off every time I was baking, which is pretty often. And you can ask anybody, I do 24 not burn my cakes. I am a professional baker. 25 26 Morgan also said something about living together as a family, or acting as a family, or 27 something. I didn't really get it, to be honest. I was still tired from my shift, and I really 28 just wanted to go back to bed. Morgan also said something about us all having to pay

our rent together. I did not understand why this was happening, since like I said, I barely



knew Carl and Parker. But they both gave me their portion of the rent the next day, so I put my signature on a cheque for the total amount and gave it to Morgan. I thought I should get some sleep and I would ask Morgan about it before next month's rent was due. I do not remember signing any document.

The next day, as I was thinking more about what Morgan had said, it just seemed really suspicious to me. It actually made me reach out to my friend who lives close-by to see if her building had any vacancies. I loved living so close to my work, and you couldn't beat the rent, but the quarters really were cramped, and honestly, the whole new rent situation kind of freaked me out. I knew there was something weird going on.

On the night of the fire, I was listening to music in my room, just beginning to doze off. All of the sudden, I smelled smoke. When I went to open my door the handle burned my hand, but I managed to get it open. I must have screamed pretty loudly, because Parker came out of the first room. I saw Carl batting away at the flames. I yelled at him to come, but he said he was going to put out the fire himself. I don't know what on earth he was thinking! The whole floor was filled with smoke, and the flames seemed to be everywhere. It was so hard to breathe that I almost passed out right there, but Parker and I managed to get out of the house somehow. That's really all I can remember until I woke up in the hospital the next day.

I found out later that I had to be treated by paramedics for smoke inhalation, that I sustained 2% partial thickness burns to my face and both hands, plus a Grade 1 smoke inhalation injury. I am just glad the paramedics were there to intubate and resuscitate me. I know I'm lucky to be alive.

#### **Sworn Statement of Morgan Kaye**

1 My name is Morgan Kaye. I am the owner of the house located at 50 Knightsbridge

2 Garden Circle. I purchased the house in June of 2015 as an investment property. At that

3 time, the house was being rented to a single family. However, I realized that I could

4 make more money by renting the rooms out to students at the local college instead.

6 Once my purchase of the house was finalized, I immediately installed locks on each of

the bedroom doors and installed a door on the stairs leading to the basement to make

8 individual "units". In total, I created three bedrooms on the second floor and one

9 bedroom in the basement. In 2019, I rented the house to four tenants. Bedroom #1 was

rented to Parker Reed for \$300 per month, bedroom #2 to Siham Sanga for \$375 per

month, and bedroom #3 to Carl George for \$300 per month. I rented the basement to

Blair Brown for \$375 per month.

In July 2019, I received a call from Alex Riley from the Mariposa Fire Service. Officer

Riley told me that the house had been inspected, and several Fire Code violations had

been noted. Riley told me that the kitchen upstairs had to go. After this conversation I

immediately had the kitchen demolished, removing the superficial wall as well as both

the oven and refrigerator.

I met with Officer Riley a few more times at the house to discuss the violations and how

they were to be rectified. I did as much as I could to rectify the violations. I had installed

a carbon monoxide detector on each floor and demolished the second floor kitchen, but

I really didn't understand some of the retrofit requirements. When Officer Riley came to

the house on August 26, I was told that that if I continued to rent the upstairs bedrooms

to individual students then I would need to install fire alarms and fire-resistant doors in

each bedroom. In addition to the cost of this, I knew that the retrofits would be noisy and

intrusive for the tenants. I asked Riley if there was any other way to go about it. Riley

told me that if I decided to rent the second floor to one family. I would not need to

complete the same noisy, intrusive, and expensive retrofits.



they would be happy to agree.

Officer Riley also suggested that I prepare a document to specify that I rented the upper level of the house to Carl, Siham, and Parker as a family, not individual tenants, and that they were responsible for maintaining the batteries in the smoke alarms in the kitchen and upper floor hallway. They were also to pay rent as a family through one person. I knew the tenants were all very close anyways, they are always hanging out and chatting. I thought that if they could potentially avoid weeks of work on their suites,

The next day I prepared a document detailing the arrangement. I discussed this proposal with Siham, Parker and Carl and it was just as I thought. They all made an oral agreement to live as a family in the manner described in the document I had prepared. Siham signed the document right there. I do not think Carl or Parker had a chance to sign it. I have provided a photocopy of the agreement, although with everything that has happened, I must have misplaced the original.

Once I had their agreement, I completed all of the corrective work Officer Riley had specified. I did not apply the retrofits that Riley said were required if I continued to rent to individual tenants, since they were to be treated as a family. I also told Siham, Parker, and Carl that the locks on their bedroom doors had to be removed to meet the Fire Code requirements. I had planned to go to the house on September 15 to check that they had been removed, but because of the fire I never got the chance.

I know that after the fire had been put out, the firefighters found a hotplate in Carl's room. I had no idea that Carl had this in his room or that he was cooking in there. As I said, I had the entire second floor kitchen demolished. Nobody mentioned anything to me. I respect my tenants' privacy, and it's a small space, so whenever we chat it is always in the common area.

This fire is a tragedy. Even though the fire is not my fault, my reputation as a landlord is ruined. I do not want to speak ill of the dead, but I blame Carl. After the fire, Blair told



me that they had been drinking with Carl before the fire, and also suggested Carl might have had a drinking problem. If I had known this, I would never have allowed Carl to live in the house.

#### **Sworn Statement of Blair Brown**

1 My name is Blair Brown. I previously lived at 50 Knightsbridge Garden Circle, prior to

the fire on September 14, 2019. I now live temporarily with a friend on Albina Way.

3

- 4 50 Knightsbridge Garden Circle is a detached house with two floors and a basement. I
- 5 moved into the house in August 2017 when I started the Golf Facility Operations
- 6 program at Yourtown College. At first, I rented one of the three bedrooms on the second
- 7 floor. It was a small room but since I was rarely home it did not bother me. In May 2019,
- 8 the basement became available. Since I wanted a bit more privacy, I decided to move
- 9 downstairs. Around the same time, Siham Sanga, Carl George, and Parker Reed
- moved in upstairs. I'm not sure if anybody knew each other before moving in, but we all
- 11 became acquainted pretty quickly.

- For instance, about once a week I would go out for a couple drinks with friends at
- 14 Cousin's Deli down the street. But Mariposa isn't too big, and we would run into Carl
- there more often than not, sitting alone. He seemed like a decent guy, and it's no fun to
- sit alone, so I would often invite him over to our table. There were a few times where he
- did go overboard, though, and I had to help him back to the house.

18

- 19 Even after I moved downstairs, I would still go up to the main floor to use the kitchen or
- 20 hang out with the other tenants. I would always make a special trip upstairs when Siham
- was baking groundnut cakes you could smell them through the whole house. They
- were delicious groundnut cakes. But while the cakes always tasted amazing, the baking
- process did not always go as planned for Siham and the fire alarm would constantly go
- off. One time Siham stood on top of the kitchen table and hit the alarm with a broom to
- 25 try to disable it. I think Siham even removed the batteries from the smoke alarm
- 26 upstairs.

27

- 28 On July 19, 2019. I was sitting on the front step of the house enjoying my last fifteen
- 29 minutes outside before I left for work at the college. An individual dressed in a uniform



30 approached me and identified themselves as a Fire Inspector. Alex Riley was the name. 31

Alex asked to see the inside of the house, so I opened the door to let them in, and then

went back outside. I left shortly after, because I had to get going. I didn't think anything

of it until the owner of the house, Morgan Kaye, brought the subject up with me a few

34 weeks later.

Over the past two years I have become friendly with Morgan. In August, I received

37 several notices indicating that work in my unit was needed to improve the house's fire

safety. Morgan was apologetic about the intrusion, but a new smoke alarm needed to

be installed. I believe a carbon monoxide detector was also installed. I'm not sure about

the work done to the main floor or the second floor, but I remember Morgan mentioning

a few days before the fire that there was a good deal on fire alarms at BoxMart. We

would often let each other know when we came across a good deal, since everything in

43 this city is getting so expensive.

On the night of the fire, I left the house around 10:30 p.m. to go to the bar with my

friends. Before I left, I had a few drinks with Carl. Since he usually likes to party, I asked

Carl if he wanted to come out with my friends, but he declined the invitation. He

48 mentioned that he was starving and he was going to make macaroni and cheese.

I returned to the house after last call around 2:15 a.m. and I could not believe my eyes.

51 There were firefighters all over the place and smoke was billowing out of the house. I

just stood there in shock and watched as the firefighters worked on putting the fire out. I

didn't know where any of the other tenants were. I think they were finally able to put it

out around 3:00 a.m., around which time I found out that Carl did not make it out alive.
